

Plenty Of Action Seen In Local Election May 6

Clayton voters will have a full slate to choose from in the election May 6 when 11 candidates will be seeking the five town commissioners' seats.

Incumbent Mayor William P. Bagley is seeking re-election as the mayor with no opponent. He is a graduate of Clayton High School, served with the US Army two years, and graduated from East Carolina College with a degree in science in 1960. Mayor Bagley is presently a member of board of trustees at Horne Memorial Methodist Church, is a member of the Civitan Club, and is on the Community Improvement Council. He is past president of the Community Improvement Council, Clayton Civitans and the Clayton Little League. He served as town commissioner in 1965-67.

M. W. Knott is seeking re-election as town commissioner. He is the owner and operator of Clayton Mobil Milling, an electrical inspector for the county and a member of the County Electric League and Men's Investment Club. Richard Woodard also seeks re-election as town commissioner. He is a member of the American Legion, a deacon in the First Baptist Church, and was named Outstanding Citizen of the Year in 1967 by the Clayton Merchants Association.
